Fourth meeting Nicosia 12-13 November 2012

Future Worlds Center hosted the Project Q3.eu fourth partners' meeting in their premises and welcomed the project partners from Portugal, Germany and Italy, as well as external associates of the organization from Cyprus.

The decision for the 4th meeting to be hosted in Nicosia was to due to Cyprus's Presidency of the council of the European Union, which gave the opportunity to all partners to attend several cultural events under the auspices of the Cyprus Presidency.

During the first day, the partners proceeded with covering the planned agenda, discussing project logistics, elaborating on a sequence European project plan, and finally identifying issues , brainstorming and exchanging best practices stories on new strategies and actions for Social Economy Enterprises (SEEs).

During the second day, the partners participated in a Structured Democratic Dialogue Process Colaboratory facilitated by Yiannis Laouris. The partners tried to find the most important characteristics that would assist an SEE to achieve its mission in a sustainable way. This procedure not only gave all participants, food for thought but also provided them with a roadmap in achieving their goals.

Procedure of the Meeting in Nicosia

After a short presentation on the hosting organization, *Future Worlds Center*, the partners went straight to discussing project logistics. The discussion went onwards, when all participants started brainstorming on ideas of Social Economy sustainability and developing applications to match European grants.

After a brief introduction on the first day, the second day was a great success participating in a Structured Democratic Dialogue Co-laboratory with the to answer the very important question "What are important Characteristics that would assist an SEE to achieve its mission in a sustainable way?". The question had been discussed and decided upon between the participants.


After having generated, clarified, and clustered the ideas, each participant chose five factors that they thought were the most important. The voting results were used to select factors for the subsequent structuring phase to identify inter-relations among the generated factors. Participants managed to structure 9 factors during the time available.

The dialogue made it possible for the participants to identify important characteris-

tics that could assist a Social Economy Enterprise to achieve its mission in a sustainable way and draw distinctions between fundamental strong leverage inhibitors at the bottom of the Root Cause Map and symptomatic inhibitors along the branches of the Map.
